NINTH ASEAN EDUCATION MINISTERS MEETING

The ninth ASEAN Education Ministers Meeting (9th ASED) was held on 25 May 2016 in Selangor, Malaysia in conjunction with the Third ASEAN Plus Three Education Ministers Meeting (3rd APT EMM) and the Third East Asia Summit Education Ministers Meeting (3rd EAS EMM).

The Meeting was presided by H.E. Dato' Seri Mahdzir Khalid, Minister of Education of Malaysia and developed on the theme of Fostering ASEAN Community of Learners: Empowering Lives through Education, which emphasises the profound significance of education in enhancing life quality and offering children and young generations opportunity to participate in and benefit from the realisation of a prosperous ASEAN Community 2025.



WORKSHOP ON ICT FOR THE EFFECTIVE LESSON

23 JUNE 2016, HO CHI MINH CITY VIETNAM

In November 2014, SEAMEO CELLL held the first international workshop on “KOMINKAN - the Successful Model of CLCs and Lessons to be Learned”. In November 2015, the Centre proceeded with the workshop on “Curriculum Development for CLCs” for managers of CLCs from 8 southern provinces as a follow-up of the KOMINKAN workshop.

To continue the chain of events on enhancing CLC operational capacity in Vietnam, on 23 June 2016, SEAMEO CELLL hosted a training workshop on ICT for the Effective Lesson to assist 25 teachers of CLCs in HCM City and the neighbouring provinces in using PowerPoint and Photoshop to design more effective and engaging lessons with the aid of technology. The workshop facilitator was Mr. Khau Huu Phuoc, Manager of Research and Training Department of SEAMEO CELLL. The Centre also invited Mr. Pham Minh Duc, Head of Continuing Division, Dong Nai DOET and Mr. Le Trong Nghia, Former Vice-President of the Association of Learning Promotion, Binh Tan District as visiting guests to share their personal experiences.

VIETNAM MOET REPRESENTATIVES ATTEND THE XIV GERMAN ADULT EDUCATION CONFERENCE

On 9-10 June 2016, by invitation of DVV International, Mr. Le Huy Lam, SEAMEO CELLL Centre Director and Mr. Nguyen Cong Hinh, Director-General, Continuing Education Department, Vietnam MOET, attended the XIV German Adult Education Conference, Europe's biggest Congress for Non-Formal Learning, in Berlin, Germany. "Digital Participation for All" was chosen as the central motto of the Conference with 1500 participants from 40 countries and 900 German Community Learning Centres ("Volkshochschulen, VHS)". Mr. Joachim Gauck, President of the Federal Republic of Germany, opened the conference.

The Centre Director was invited to be one of the panelists for Forum 4 "Digital-global-inclusive: More equitability through digitalisation" in which he discussed the impact of digitalisation on the participation of the Vietnamese people in current social issues.

Previously, from 5 –8 June 2016, Mr. Lam and Mr. Hinh also visited and worked with various VHS as well as government education agencies in the cities of Berlin and Hannover.

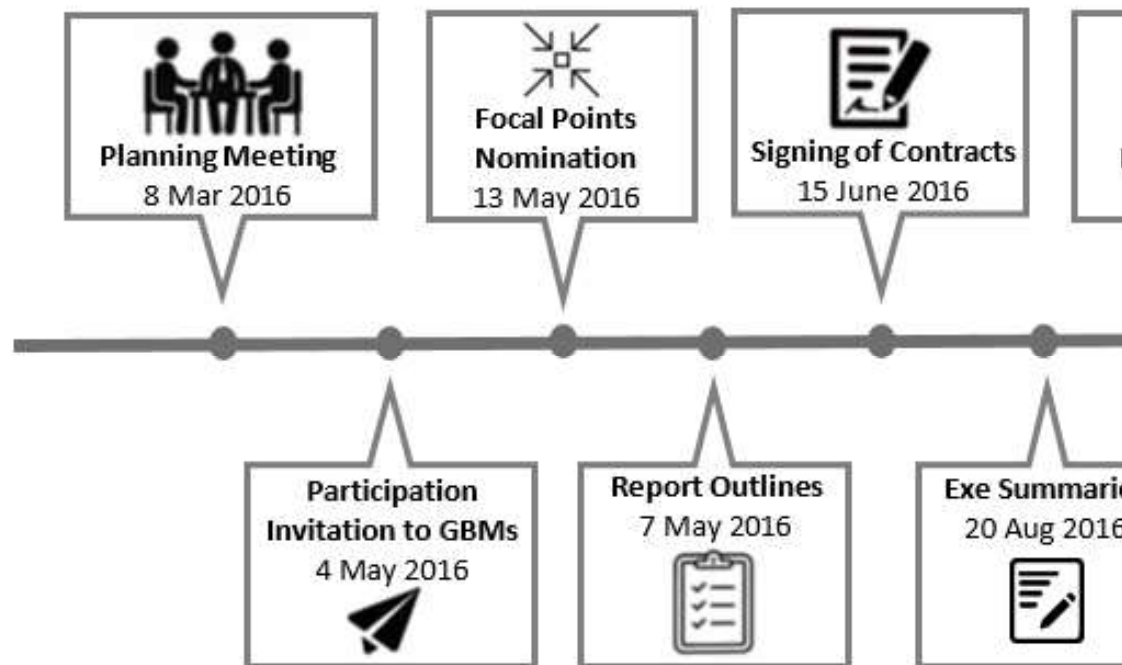

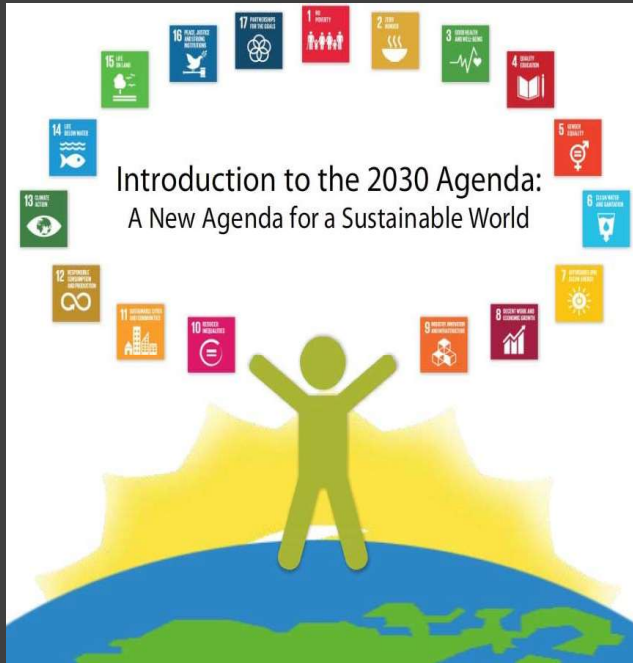

STRATEGIC OBJECTIVES

1. Universalise education and conduct literacy programmes for adult learners;
2. Improve ICT and foreign language skills for the population;
3. Improve professional skills for the working people; and
4. Improve life skills for pupils, students and the working people.

INITIAL ACHIEVEMENTS OF THE PROJECT (2013-2015)

1 Adult literacy rate:

Age group 15-60: 97.3%

Age group 15-35: 98.5%

Newly—illiterated continue their learning: 83.9%

100% provinces/ cities are recognised as the meeting standards for right-age primary education generalisation;

100% provinces/ cities are recognised as the

2 Participation rate in ICT enhancement programmes reached 81.2%.

Government officials and public servants who reach Foreign Language Proficiency Levels 2 and 3: 31.2% and 9.9% respectively.

Rate of workers whose foreign language and ICT competencies meet basic job requirements reached 43.7%.

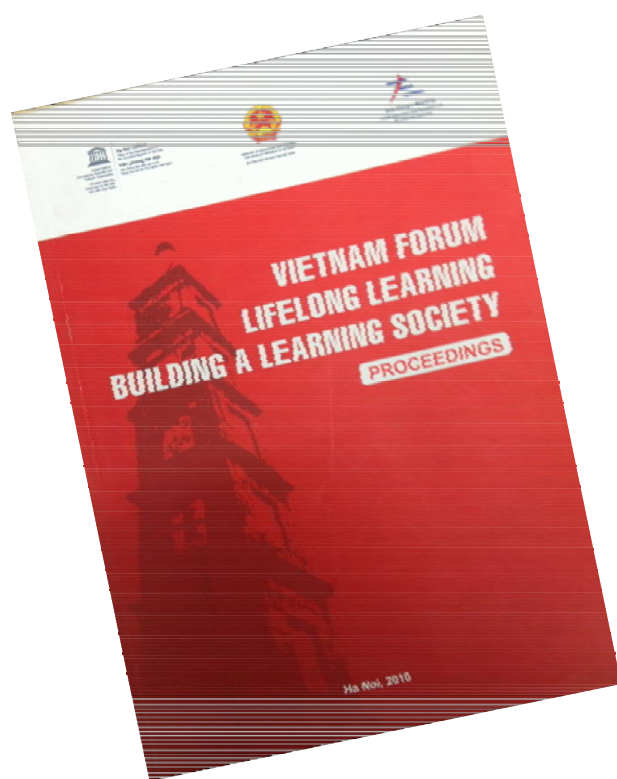

4 72.6% pupils and students were engaged in life-skills education through curriculum subjects.

25% pupils and students were engaged in dedicated life-skills courses.
